Although the Bush Administration came into office with an avowed determination to promote closer alliance relations, the failure of the government headed by Prime Minister Junichiro Koizumi s inability to overcome economic stagnation that has lasted more than a decade has started to lower U.S. regard for a country which still remains an important military ally. U.S.-Japan relations concern Members and Committees with responsibilities or interests in trade and international finance and economics, U.S. foreign policy, ballistic missile defense (BMD), and regional security. The latter include North Korea s nuclear and missile proliferation, China s potential emergence as the dominant regional military power, and U.S. military bases in Japan, whose importance has been underscored once again by their role in facilitating the operations of U.S. forces in Afghanistan and will likely also be important if war with Iraq ensues.
